History

Two larger oil collection companies unified to pass new regulations on oil collection in Colorado

- HB 10-1125
 - Lumped grease trap pumping and yellow grease together
 - Annual reports and forms
 - Annual reports for every person registered to pick up oil
 - Triplicate forms on all pickups
 - Registrations of people and vehicles
 - Annual Fees
 - \$1,140 per nonvehicle registrant
 - \$570 per vehicle
 - \$96 per person
 - \$3,000 direct fees and \$30,000 administrative

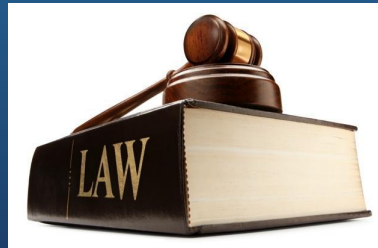


Effects on smaller collectors:

- Unable to meet fees or add administrative employee
- Exposed confidential information
- Paperwork overwhelming
- Bottom line- to stay in business something had to change...

Therefore...

- Small collection companies unified together
- Set to accomplish 2 goals:
 - Give input on rules being set for new law
 - Investigate repeal of the law all together
- Held elections and voted for positions in organization
- Used capital that would go to fees to fund organization



NCORA was formed

- Hired a law firm
- Hired a Lobbyist
- Met with state Senators and Representatives
- Wrote language for bill



Successfully and unanimously passed SB 12-077
and repealed HB 10-1125

- Is there a cost effective benefit to a nation-wide organization to protect the small oil collectors?
